April 28, 2025

I. Call to order/Roll Call

President Merrily Dixon called to order the regular meeting of the Fort Dodge Public Library Board of Trustees at 3:32 p.m. on April 28, 2025 at the Fort Dodge Public Library.

II. Approval of Agenda

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Kelleher and seconded by Hindman. Motion carried.

III. Approval of Minutes

A motion to approve the March meeting minutes was made by Kramer and seconded by Hindman. Motion carried.

IV. Comments/Questions from the Public

V. Bills and Financial Reports

- a. Kelleher moved payments in the amount of \$8,984.74 to be approved in the Gift and Memorial Accounts. Kramer seconded. Motion carried.
- b. Kramer moved payments in the amount of \$11,328.13 to be approved in the City Funds Accounts. Kelleher seconded. Motion carried.

VI. Communications/Board Education

- a. Employee Introduction Part-Time LA Is
 - 1. Shaina discussed her duties at the circulation desk.
- b. Legislative Update The State Library of Iowa sent a notification they have received 50% partial award for total grants from Federal funding and are waiting on full apportionment for the FFY25 Grants to States program. The State Library is prioritizing what they can realistically maintain looking forward. These include programs and resources that give Iowa residents and libraries the greatest value. Services that would be hard for single libraries to fund on their own and proved a broad impact statewide. Top priorities are:
 - State Library staff that are federally-funded
 - SILO services (ILL system, Library Talk, Iowa Library Directory, PLOW websites, and tech support for State Library resources such as People's Law Library, and Iowa Heritage Digital Collections, plus others)
 - IA Shares delivery statewide at least one day per week
 - Bridges platform and consortium management fee

VII. Committee Reports

a. FDPL Foundation – Investments have outlook of 5% growth over the year, but markets can change rapidly.

VIII. Director's Report

Programming/Services

- Advantage Archives finished digitizing the Messenger microfilm and have begun loading to the new website.
- The Friends Book Sale begins April 28th for members.
- Schmidt is finalizing the summer reading plans which will not include formal storytimes
 due to staffing challenges. Extra Magnatile Days and guest speaker storytimes may be
 scheduled as replacements.
- Schmidt attended the Autism Awareness Walk & Resource Fair on April 26th.

Building

- Viking completed the five-year inspection of the sprinkler system on April 24th. They also replaced a backflow valve that had failed.
- Midstate repaired both humidifiers and ordered a new pump for the HVAC system.
- The boilers passed the annual inspection.
- The carbon monoxide detector will need to be replaced by Woodman Controls on their next preventative maintenance visit due to intermittent issues.
- Greg painted part of the hallway and the main entrance this month.
- New closers on the north and south entrances and the children's restroom were installed.

Personnel

- Schmidt invited a candidate who previously had an online interview for the Youth Services Librarian position to come for an in-person interview. Due to scheduling issues this will take place mid-May.
- Pascale accepted the Adult Services Librarian position and began the role March 31st.

Director's Report - May 2025

Programming/Services

- The Summer Reading Programs kick off Monday, June 2nd. I have included information on all three programs (kids, teens, and adults) in this month's board packet. Staff have some great things planned for this summer and I am looking forward to the chaos.
- We recently received new marketing materials and brand guidelines for the lowa Adventure Pass program. We haven't gotten a date yet as to when the new site will be ready for launch but I know they are hoping for shortly after Memorial Day. Alexis has been hard at work creating new marketing materials for us.

Building

• The main drain on the sprinkler system now needs to be replaced. Viking will be here sometime in the next month to repair it. (Estimated cost is \$1,185.)

Remodel/Renovation

David Vinjamuri was here May 12th & 13th to tour the building, talk to staff, and assess what we can do to make it more user friendly, increase use, and better utilize our space both now and when we remodel/renovate. David thinks he can help us increase our circulation/use by at least 30%. We should have his final report by mid-July. He said we could schedule a zoom meeting with everyone to review his recommendations.

State Library News

- I recently signed the paperwork indicating that we plan to participate in the Enrich lowa program for FY26.
- Because of cuts at the Federal level, the State Library will be discontinuing funding of the tutoring resource BrainFuse HelpNow as of June 30th. Another library has already reached out to everyone about the possibility of forming a consortium to purchase this service. I did indicate we might be interested, depending on the cost.
- In an effort to maintain free statewide delivery services (IAShares), the State Library will cut service back to one day a week. They are currently working with our delivery service vendor to work out the logistics of this change so no date has been set for when the switch will be made.

Budget

- I am currently working with Jamie to determine what the best option is for reducing our budget by \$51,000 for FY26 since we still have some unknowns with all of our staff changes. We hope to have a final plan in place soon.
- We received notice from the Deardorf Foundation in early May that they were able to fund \$25,000 of our \$50,000 request this year.

Personnel

- Bill Westin has been hired as our new custodian. He has previous janitorial experience, is very dedicated and conscientious, and a very personable guy. We are excited to have him join the Library's staff.
- Stephanie Evenson (HR) and I interviewed Anastasia Peratopoulos for the Youth Services Librarian position on Saturday, May 17, 2025. It went very well and I am happy to report that we offered her the position and she accepted. Our hope is that Anastasia will be able to start sometime in late June. I think she will be a great addition to our team and am looking forward to working with her.

Miscellaneous

- We will be closed Thursday morning, May 29th for staff training. We will be reviewing safety/security procedures, important policies, and information on the summer reading programs.
- My three-year term on the Ann Smeltzer Charitable Trust Board of Trustees ends on June 30, 2025. I am willing to serve another three-year term.

REMINDER: The Board will need to appoint new officers and new representatives to the Foundation and Friends boards at the regular meeting in June.
